





- Consider community safety as impact on outdoor play and exercise
- Partner with Healthy Corner Store initiative

If a change is needed, what should they look at doing?

- Need to look at more adults
- Listen to youth
- Look more at youth engagement
- Community policing
- Programs for youth
- Safe zones for youth
- Increase crime awareness, see something say something

- Increase work programs for youth
- Increase re-entry programs
- Start younger with youth mentorship programs
- Target a community and have a strategic plan for empowering that community
- Work with schools to reduce suspension
- In-school suspension

Team Activity SEL (All Environments)



CHANGE/ REFOCUS

If a change is needed, what should they look at doing?

- Birth to Five missing from the focus
- Support indicator family life (maternal child health)/parents/siblings
- Preschool/ childcare children at school
- Screening/ assessments

If they are on-track, what additional tasks should they do?

- Extending environments to be inclusive of Birth to Five
- Extend coaching opportunities to pre-school (early childhood educators)
- Development Outcomes "growing out" measures already in place at the younger age

- Improving primary education (middle/high school)
- Collaboration/ Empowerment Groups led by youth - peer supported groups
- Defining social emotional learning self awareness, social awareness
- Social Emotional Wheel (what is expected/norms?) by age group (pre-school vs. older youth)
- Cultural awareness

Team Activity SEL (Trauma Sensitive Community)



NOT ON TRACK

(SLIDE 1 OF 2)

If a change is needed, what should they look at doing?

- Need to do more work with youth in schools and getting the word out to more professionals outside the task force
- Yes, should change focus because a shooting may happen and we don't have protection.
- Working in more schools and youth about ACES
- Getting word out to more schools and youth
- Focus on the shooter, preventing more shooters
- Teach youth about resiliency and how to self care, to support themselves
- Having officers in private schools
- Need more resources in schools
- Making sure community has security so no one gets hurt

If they are on-track, what additional tasks should they do?

- Get the word/resources out to the masses
- Get more supports in place
- Continue working with faith based organizations to help them help their parishioners
- Help education youth on signs of trauma and how to identify trauma
- Help education more teachers to identify signs of trauma
- We can be prepared for anything that may happen in our community
- "Us kids need attention if we have a problem"

Team Activity SEL (Trauma Sensitive Community)



NOT ON TRACK

(SLIDE 2 OF 2)

- Trauma-informed education for adults and children in schools, churches, communities
- Addressing the needs now to prevent issues in the future/improving quality of life
- Address, educate on and assist with bullying and what causes it/damage it does
- On bullying having a strong, consistent and non-bias discipline and educational system in place in all schools, churches, communities to combat bullying, teach what bullying is, the damages and effects of it, who is a bully, how bullies and those bullied can be helped. How: speakers, trainings, involvement, events/activities, movements, resources.

- Target areas of bullying: stigmas (HIV, disabilities, LGBTQ+, low income, culture, illness, abuse, family history - e.g. foster care, incarceration, etc.
- Community Outreach/Inclusion
- More programs/ organizations/ activities/ responsibilities
- Get more people in community organizations involved
- Implementing a plan to roll out the master plan to lay people
- Engage families
- Kids being able to talk with staff in their school
- Teachers need to be alerted if there is a situation
- Being trauma-informed aware and able to identify those in need/having difficulties; also providing necessary support to them and their families




What are the 3 most important issues/biggest needs for our community?


