
FY 2019 Attendee Comparison






















- Could not read all the data.
- Not enough time to converse about the issues.
- Not enough time for conversations.
- Number of guided question and limited explanation of topics to young people.
- The table activity was confusing at first and towards the middle but I understood during the end.
- We still need to connect more.
- More time for the activity.



Suggestions/ Comments

- Balance tables with young and older attendees for better understanding of activities.
- Being that this is my second time being in a community hearing, I enjoyed them because I feel like youth, teens, and adult voices are being voiced but not really heard but today felt like our voices were heard and there is going to be something done.
- A great opportunity to show our children we are about their ideas and challenges.
- Need outside of the box suggestions. Need to dig deeper to get the community needs met. Remove barriers and hold Future Leaders accountable for their future.
- •I'm hoping to see some change. I think it was good. I heard man good ideas that may increase and decrease good and bad situations that may need help.
- •I think that the Birth to 22 can do more educational & helpful communication groups like the one that we had today to help many others understand that a variety of people care about others feeling and thought like how some people make fun of them because they are a different race or gender or how they're unique or don't look like you so they treat them differently.
- We need more time for learning. We also need more educational activities.
- Additional time to work on activity.

- Maybe try a rotation, so that all groups can touch base with all subjects.
- Get started a little quicker so there is adequate time for conversation.
- Very good job. Have more topics to talk about and have more time and work stations for each topic.
- This presentation could be presented at the local PTA/PTO SAC meetings a the local schools in PBC.
- The whole community should know about events like this. This should be mandatory. More funds should be issued into events like this. Over time things should actually change.
- Less topics to discuss. Discuss whole group, give ideas/ answer questions all together so others can piggy back on ideas and give suggestions.
- Continue to provide information to community.
- More activities.



Suggestions/ Comments

- Provide more explanation at start of meeting so kids understand certain topics more in depth. And utilize more language that is age appropriate for kids too.
- Should not just be students who are going well but students who are affected by these common matters.
- We should talk about planning something (like a program/ get together) for each topic that was presented.
- Appreciated the opportunity to share and listen to various groups also share their thoughts on the Birth to 22 indicators. Data was helpful in guiding the conversation and assessing progress.
- Community conversations should be held at varying times to involve multiple stakeholders (parents, providers/agencies, elected officials, youth, etc.) Great job including the youth! The Northwood neighborhood associated meeting was held tonight at the same time. Perhaps joining the neighborhood meeting in the future would draw more parents.
- We should create a fieldtrip somewhere so the kids can be physically involved in helping change our world.
