The Digital Divide

(inequitable access to computers & internet)

- Distance learning protocols adopted during COVID-19 made existing inequities more obvious & more urgent.
- Need to find ways to support students transitioning back into the classroom.

Post-Secondary Options

Green – On track

(instead of only promoting traditional 2 & 4 year degrees)


- Some progress in promoting certification/apprenticeship programs for post-high school education.
- Still a tendency to inaccurately stereotype these programs as less intellectual or easier than traditional degrees.

Financial Resources

(for post-high school education)

- Ensure all families and students get access to the information and resources to continue education.
- Many in our community have been financially impacted by COVID-19, so these resources are more critical now.





Achieve PBC / Educational Supports

The Digital Divide:

 We must also continue to get families and parents on board with diversity, equity and inclusion efforts.

Post-Secondary Options:


 We must empower students to choose their path based on interests and skills, and then give them the proper support to pursue it.

Financial Resources:

 The Achieve 2.0 approach to Financial Supports (financial wellness, financial planning, and access to resources) seems to be the right focus. But there is a lot of work to do to get the information into the community and connecting students to resources.

Health & Wellness

Access to Healthy Food:

- $\,\circ\,$ Collaboration among organizations that do similar work collective impact
- Continue to communicate services available, many times people aren't aware.
 More PSAs since those seem to work well.
- $\,\circ\,$ Education around what is healthy, make sure it is culturally competent


Access to Healthcare:

- $\,\circ\,$ Linking people to primary medical homes
- $\,\circ\,$ Redirecting from emergency rooms as a primary care mechanism

Safe Spaces for Outdoor Play:

- $\,\circ\,$ Use of spaces during times when they're being unused (open fields, schools, etc.)
- Scholarships for extracurricular activities and sports (help with kids who can't afford to 'pay to play')
- $\,\circ\,$ Transportation to get to extracurricular locations
- $\,\circ\,$ More variety in extracurricular activities available





Social Emotional Learning (SEL)

Mental Health Resources/Mentoring:

- Mindfulness, 2-1-1, Peer advisor, Mental Health First Aid
- $\ensuremath{\circ}$ Address equitable access to services.

Trust:

- Connecting with and developing relationships with caring adults, safe supportive space where youth feel valued, elevate student voices (codecision makers)
- $\ensuremath{\circ}$ Address equitable access to spaces.
- $_{\odot}$ Trust youth enough to listen to their input before decisions are made.

Communication:

- Role model skills including empathy for both adults and students, getting parents involved, text line, suggestion boxes, after school space, advisory periods, bulletin boards, teen/peer ambassadors.
- $\ensuremath{\circ}$ Allow the time needed to really hear youth.



- Informal opportunities for talking to someone/having a safe space (not necessarily needing to see a counselor or therapist; for example Mindfulness Clubs)

Living Wages:



- There is a lot of pressure around education, but students don't feel prepared for "real life" issues – busy work instead of work that is meaningful after graduation

Lack of Exposure/ Awareness & Representation

- Students are unaware of other things that they can pursue
- Many students who dropped out, did not know that they could get back on a path to graduation, and that once they graduated, there was a place that they can enroll for free because of their economic status - 2year degree, 4-year degree opportunities
- The lack of representation in professions, careers, post-secondary institutes

Mentorships

Red – This is still an issue! Yellow – More work needed

Green – On track


- Lack of mentorship; Lack of support/guidance
- Lack of encouragement and support from family members and those they are close to the youth
- Youth don't know where to go or who to ask
- Mentors: have a lack of knowledge on how to help the youth

Cycle of Poverty

- Youth report feel they can't break the cycle
- Students often have to walk away from positive activities to bring income home
- Kills motivation

Education to Employment Pathways for Disconnected Youth

Lack of Exposure/ Awareness & Representation:

- Need more career/certification opportunities the result could increase employment rate
- $\circ\;$ Need to promote resources that are available in the community
- o NOTE: You can't be what you can't see!
- Don't see people who look like you in specific fields, roles, at universities, etc.

Mentorships:

- $\,\circ\,\,$ Engage with mentee one-on-one and help them with their struggles
- $\,\circ\,\,$ There are adults who are helping, but need to help themselves first
- $\circ\;$ Need self-help programs and some relaxation strategies so that they can be more effective
- $\circ\;$ Meet them where they are and where their interest lie
- Trying to fit kids in a box where they don't fit instead make them creative and innovators, help them with art, community services projects - working on their minds and they will fit the youth fit into any box that they want to

Cycle of Poverty:

- $\circ\;$ Poverty is a big thing that causes that lack of exposure and access to experience
- $\circ~$ Help should be directed at poverty; can kill one's motivation and can be the best motivation that they have in their life
- $\circ~$ Education on how to increase credit
- Ensure all jobs have a living wage
- Promoting JobCorp
- $\,\circ\,\,$ Educational programs that also provide stipends or jobs



Strengthening Quality Out of School Time (OST)

Mental Health:

- $\,\circ\,$ Discussion of Mental Health Fatigue.
- $\,\circ\,$ Isolation of children now more an issue in the pandemic.
- $\,\circ\,$ Work from Prime Time on social emotional support initially in response to Parkland.
- $\,\circ\,$ Intentional SEL practices are needed.
- $\,\circ\,$ Take advantage of Prime Time's SEL offerings.

Transportation:

- Collaboration with public transportation or starting ride sharing program with incentives.
- $\,\circ\,$ Developing Parental or Guardian consent forms.
- $\,\circ\,$ Consideration of safety and liability.
- $\,\circ\,$ Look at allocation for funding for transportation to already funded programs.
- Opportunity to engage other partners to collaborate.
- Need to check with other teams to see what work is being done on transportation already.

Special Needs:

- $\,\circ\,$ Attempt to complete pilot training program for practitioners working with Prime Time.
- Possibly integrate information on special needs resources into training so practitioners can share with families.










FY 2021 – Evaluations Virtual Conversation #4 2/28/2021




FY 2021 – Evaluations Total Responses



 Interactive elements and use cases that trigger conversations especially amongst the youth joining the conversation ; Their comments were insightful but there was no approach to draw everyone into a dialog with leading questions and examples.

- It seemed more geared towards professionals in the field then the community as a whole
- I would say the time of the event it would be better if it started around 4:30.
- Too much information, not relatable to the average person in the community, not engaging, and boring. Suggestion: switch up the speakers and ask questions throughout the conversation.
- Length of discussion in breakouts.
- Presentation (power point) could have been simpler, allowing the students and parents to engage in more conversations.
- Many people were trying to talk over each other might've been the only problem I can think of.

- Virtual seemed to make difficult for youth to be vocal.
- More youth involvement
- For once, I would like to see an idea or conversation develop into a sustainable culture shift. That said, the conversation was fantastic.
- It's so easy to lose track of time during a virtual session. More reminders from the host would be helpful.
- There really is no negative feedbacks though I would like for more people my age to be able to attend these meets.

- Presentation too long, geared towards professionals.




Opportunities for Improvement

Suggestions/ Comments

- Need to lead with stories and walk the group through a story so all parties engage based examples at the grassroots level. I recommend conditional statements that need the audience to provide answers in the chat or on the mic before proceeding to the next part of the story. The majority of the information I heard gave a clear understanding of the mission of the organization.
- It is a valuable space but try to not make it so formal.
- Keep it going.
- Continue to offer these forums and target more youth participation while offering incentives!
- I really enjoyed the event it was a nice service.
- Have the parents and students be apart of the planning and allow them to present. Children respond more to each other.
- Duration of a late evening training.
- Spanish Conversation
- Suggestion: Keep up the great work.

- I wish the meeting would have been earlier in the day.
- Involve students and other community members in planning for the presentation.
- Maybe just be slightly more organized.
- Presentations needs to be more interactive and interesting.
- There were lots of students (yay!), but they need extra encouragement to speak up. Let's look for creative ways to carve out room specifically for their voices, without making them compete with adults for airtime.
- I would suggest for better distribution of information, I would like for more people my age to have an opportunity to actively engage with the community, although sadly they are not really aware of any of this. If this information could be shared through schools I believe it would reach out to them.
